



We gratefully appreciate your service to the club and wish you the best in sailing and your future life adventures!










WELCOME TO OUR NEW COMMODORE

Boating goals? Kathy wants to be able to save Curtis if he goes overboard while Curtis wants to go on some cruises and learn about places to anchor.



What compelled them to join MCYC? They kept looking at copies of the Masthead at Coneys and were very impressed.



























MCYC Memorial Day Weekend "Pursuit" Race





Advertiser's Spotlight

West Shore Marina

This issue's featured advertiser is West Shore Marina. Located at 100 West Shore Road, it has 290 slips, four of which are occupied by MCYC members. Dry and wet winter storage is available and all marine services are on-site. Other amenities include a pool, shaded barbeque area and a ship's store.

The original location featured a wharf and buildings that could accommodate the commercial schooners of the day. Ships were Huntington's main portal to the world until the LIRR arrived in the 1880's. Schooners still delivered lumber, coal and various goods until the early 1900's. After the Second World War, the property was home to the Huffco Oil Company with numerous storage tanks and barge traffic.

Owners Arthur Gould and Armand DeRose obtained the lease in 1979. It took six years to obtain all of the necessary permits. On the morning of March 22, 1985, the Army Corps of Engineers signed off on the final document, and by that afternoon work had begun on the bulkheads. The first slip was occupied Memorial Day 1985.

Of historical interest are the two white bollards that flank the entrance to the main dock. While supervising the construction of a cofferdam in lower Manhattan in the early 70's, Armand noticed them in the silt and muck along the shoreline. They were soon on a truck to Long Island. He speculates that they could have secured ships coming from Ellis Island 150 years ago.

West Shore has supported MCYC for years by donating wet storage slips for the Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory Charity Race. Every year ten to fifteen of us queue up in early September to sign up for dry storage in the yard, while others secure wet storage at the docks.

West Shore Marina and MCYC, a great combination.
